The society benefits all the people who attend Thistles including their parents , carers and volunteers, who all live in Boston, Spalding and surrounding areas.
We partnership work with Boston college, three students attend one day a week with a learning support assistant. They gain valuable work related skills. We also work with Boston in Bloom, Sutterton Parish Council and the WEA.

1.20 How did the society benefit that community during the year?

All the people that we support play a part in the running of Thistles Market Garden. Thistles benefits by forging new partnerships. This year we have engaged with the WEA a leading provider of adult education in the UK They have organised courses which have improved the well being and self belief of many of our service users. We also support our local County Council to help litter pick and set plants around the town. This enables people who attend to socialise and become more involved in the community. There is a project in hand to provide four flower tubs for Sutterton Parish Council which will enhance the appearance of a local village. .

The society is strictly not for profit. Any surplus is ear marked to go towards the day to day running costs of the organisation. We have plans to re surface the car park and to provide disabled pathways which will improve access to our gardens and grounds. This will particularly benefit our wheelchair service users and visitors. We managed to complete our property improvements from past surpluses and still maintain a daily bus service to provide better access for existing and potential users and to provide participation opportunities to persons not in the immediate vicinity




