1.20 How did the society benefit that community during the year?

PACT ran several events to promote and encourage fruit and vegetable growing, including a seed-swap event and stalls at public events, encouraging and supporting both individuals and community garden groups. More native and fruit-bearing trees were planted at 2 local schools as the final part of the Tree Whisperers project and a school resource pack was provided on-line so that schools in Eden and elsewhere can continue to make use of the resources prepared for the project.

Other PACT events and stalls this year included a Toy Swap event and events to encourage re-using and upcycling everyday items. Also displays informing the public about plastics: encouraging people to try to use less plastic, to find alternative products and to re-use or recycle the plastics that they do use.

PACT worked closely with other groups, including Freegle and Cumbria Acton for Sustainability, Penrith Partnership and Cumbria County Council Waste Prevention team, to deliver a variety of benefits to the residents of Penrith and Eden.
