The Ferret published a number of high-profile investigations that had an impact on public life in a number of ways - for example, in supporting policy enquiries into the operation of the Freedom of Information act in Scotland. Additionally, The Ferret organised a series of media training courses and events which members were able to attend.

Each week the Ferret sends an email out with an electronic poll to our members, allowing the board to receive feedback on issues that we write about on a regular basis. In addition, to training courses and informal events hosted through the year, members were invited to elect directors at the AGM, and able to participate either physically or digitally in a consultation on a number of key management issues.


