Due to Covid 19, we suspended our on-site service in March 2020, we re-opened for a short period at the beginning of September

We have improved our previously dilapidated premises and grounds, We improve participation opportunities by providing a daily bus service for users not in the immediate vicinity. Due to COVID 19 we have had a reduced income but we have financially managed to sustain the service ready to reopen as and when we are allowed.
